

NCAA Division I Academic Performance Program Data Submission Timeline

The information listed below provides key dates regarding the NCAA Division I Academic Performance Program (APP).

January

- The NCAA Division I Committee on Academic Performance conducts an in-person meeting. The committee's report will be posted following the meeting on the Committee on Academic Performance Web site for member institutions to review updates and key actions taken by the committee. February

- Notification will be sent via e-mail and/or letter to member institutions* and NCAA Division I conference offices regarding the following:
 1. Deadlines for the Integrated Postsecondary Education Data Systems Graduation-Rate Survey (IPEDS GRS-1) (i.e., federal graduation rate data), NCAA Graduation Success Rate (GSR) and the NCAA Division I Academic Performance Program (APP) [i.e., NCAA Division I Academic Progress Rate (APR) and NCAA Division I Academic Performance Census (APC)] data submission.
 2. Information about requesting extensions of the filing deadlines.
 3. Date when the IPEDS GRS-1/federal graduation rate and GSR data collection Web site will be made available.
 4. Reminder to member institutions that the institution's user name and password are required to access the Web site.

March

- IPEDS GRS-1/federal graduation rate and GSR data collection Web site will be made available for member institutions to submit IPEDS GRS-1/federal graduation rate and GSR data. The Web site can be accessed at:

April

May

June

- June 1 – IPEDS GRS-1/federal graduation rate and GSR data due. Member institutions that do not meet this deadline will render all athletics teams and student-athletes at the institution ineligible for postseason competition (e.g., NCAA championships, bowl games).

July

August

- E-mail notification will be sent to remind member institutions* and Division I conference offices of the APR/APC data submission deadline and information about requesting an extension of the filing deadline.

August/September/October

- APR/APC data due six weeks after institution's first day of classes for the fall term. Member institutions that do not meet this deadline will render all athletics teams and student-athletes at the institution ineligible for postseason competition (e.g., NCAA championships, bowl games).

October

- The Committee on Academic Performance conducts an in-person meeting. The committee's report will be posted following the meeting on the Committee on Academic Performance Web site for member institutions to review updates and key actions taken by the committee. The following steps occur after submission of an institution's APR/APC data:

1. Correction period. After APR/APC data is submitted by the institution and is validated by the NCAA research staff, the institution will be provided a brief period of time to review its data and to submit any corrections.
2. Adjustment period. Following the amendment period, the institution will be provided a period of time to submit APR adjustments through the LSDBi waiver portal. Adjustment requests for all teams must be submitted at the same time. The portal can be accessed at:

3. Waiver of contemporaneous and historical penalties. After the institution has received a final decision on its adjustment request(s), or if the institution made no adjustment requests, the institution will be provided a period of time to submit any waivers of contemporaneous and historical penalties through the LSDBi waiver portal.
