DEFINITIONS

Contact

A contact is any face-to-face encounter between a prospect or the prospect's parents, relatives or legal guardian(s) and an institutional staff member or athletics representative during which any dialogue occurs in excess of an exchange of a greeting. Any such face-to-face encounter that is prearranged (e.g., positions himself/herself in a location where contact is possible) or that takes place on the grounds of the prospect's educational institution or at the site of organized competition or practice involving the prospect or the prospect's high school, preparatory school, two-year college or all-star team shall be considered a contact, regardless of whether any conversation occurs. However, an institutional staff member or athletics representative who is approached by a prospect or the prospect's parents, relatives or legal guardian(s) at any location shall not use a contact, provided the encounter was not prearranged and the staff member or athletics representative does not engage in any dialogue in excess of a greeting and takes appropriate steps to immediately terminate the encounter.

Evaluation

Evaluation is any off-campus activity designed to assess the academic qualifications or athletics ability of a prospect, including any visit to a prospect's educational institution (during which no contact occurs) or the observation of a prospect participating in any practice or competition at any site.

Recruiting-Person Days -- Men's Basketball

A recruiting-person day is defined as one coach engaged in an off-campus recruiting activity of prospect on one day (12:01 a.m. to midnight); two coaches engaged in recruiting activities on the same day shall use two recruiting person days.

Recruited Prospective Student-Athlete

Actions by staff members or athletics representatives that cause a prospect to become a recruited prospect at that institution are:

- a. Providing the prospect with an official visit;
- b. Having an arranged, in-person, off-campus encounter with the prospect or the prospect's parent(s), relatives or legal guardian(s);
- c. Initiating or arranging a telephone contact with the prospect, the prospect's relatives or legal guardian(s) on more than one occasion for the purpose of recruitment; and
- d. Issuing a National Letter of Intent or the institution's written offer of athletically related financial aid to the prospect (excluding summer term awards prior to initial full-time enrollment).

Telephone Calls

All electronically transmitted human voice exchange (including videoconferencing and videophones) shall be considered telephone calls. All electronically transmitted correspondence (e.g., electronic mail, Instant Messenger, facsimiles, pages, text messaging) shall not be considered telephone calls.

Contacts, Evaluations and Telephone Calls

Off-Campus Recruiters

An institutional staff member is not permitted to recruit off campus until he or she has been certified on an annual basis as to knowledge of applicable recruiting rules.

Telephone Calls During Conduct of Athletics Contest

Telephone calls to a prospect [or the prospect's relatives or legal guardian(s)] may not be made during the conduct of any of the institution's intercollegiate athletics contests in that sport until the competition has concluded and the team has been dismissed by the coach.

Telephone Calls - Institutional Staff Members -- General Rule

All telephone calls to prospects (or the prospects' parents, legal guardians or coaches) must be made by the head coach or one or more of the assistant coaches who count toward the numerical limitations in men's basketball.

Visits to a Prospect's Educational Institution

Institutional staff members may visit a prospect's educational institution on not more than one occasion during a particular week within a contact or evaluation period, regardless of the number of prospects enrolled in the institution or whether any prospect is contacted on that occasion. During the July evaluation period, there are no limitations on the number of times an institutional staff member may visit a prospect's educational institution.

DEFINITIONS (cont.)

Tournament Exception

In basketball, visiting a prospect's educational institution on consecutive days during a particular week to observe a tournament or tier of a tournament shall count as a single visit.

Counting Contacts and Evaluations

Evaluations that occur during the academic year count against the permissible number of recruiting opportunities. Outside of the academic year, evaluations do not count against the annual number of recruiting opportunities. Contacts that occur with a prospect count against the permissible number of total recruiting opportunities regardless of the time period (e.g., academic year or outside the academic year). All contacts and evaluations are subject to recruiting calendar restrictions.

Prospective Student-Athlete's Educational Institution

Any staff member desiring to contact a prospect at the prospect's educational institution first shall obtain permission for such contact from that institution's executive officer (or the executive officer's authorized representative).

Practice or Competition Site

Recruiting contact may not be made with a prospect prior to any athletics competition in which the prospect is a participant during the day or days of competition, even if the prospect is on an official or unofficial visit. Contact includes the passing of notes to a prospective by a third party on behalf of an institutional staff member. Contact and communication restrictions are as follows:

- a. No contact at any site prior to the contest on the day or days of competition;
- b. No contact from the time the prospect reports on call and becomes involved in competition-related activity to the end of the competition;
- c. No contact after the competition, including competition that requires more than one day of participation (e.g., a basketball tournament), until the prospect is released by the appropriate institutional authority and departs the dressing and meeting facility;
- d. Coaching staff members may send general correspondence to a prospect while the prospect is participating in an athletics event (other than a summer certified event or a nonscholastic event during the April contact period), provided the general correspondence is sent directly to a prospect (e.g., the front desk of the hotel, the prospective student-athlete's personal fax machine) and there is no additional party (e.g., camp employee, coach) involved in disseminating the correspondence. **[NOTE: It is not permissible to send text messages to a prospect participating in an athletics event while he is at the site of the event (e.g., arena, gymnasium).]**
- e. No contact at any basketball event during the academic year that is not part of a prospect's normal high school, preparatory school or two-year college season, or any event that is not approved, sanctioned, sponsored or conducted by the applicable state high school or two-year college association, National Federation of State High School Associations or the National Junior College Athletic Association; and
- f. All communication with a prospect, the prospect's relatives or legal guardians, the prospect's coach or any individual associated with the prospect as a result of the prospect's participation in basketball, directly or indirectly, is prohibited during the time period in which the prospect is participating in a summer certified event or a nonscholastic event during the April contact period. However, printed materials (e.g., letters, recruiting brochures, questionnaires) may be sent via regular mail (see NCAA Division I Bylaw 13.4.1) to a prospect's home while the prospect is participating in a certified or nonscholastic event.

[NOTE: It is permissible to make telephone calls to a prospect's high school coach, provided the high school coach is not in attendance at the event.]

Athletics Events Outside Contact Period

In-person contact with a prospect shall not be made on or off the member institution's campus at the site of practice or competition or for any athletics event in which the prospect participates outside the permissible contact periods. When a prospect participates in an athletics contest or event (including a noninstitutional, private camp or clinic) on a member institution's campus outside of a contact period, it is not permissible for an authorized institutional staff member to have contact with the prospect until the calendar day following his or her release from the competition. Further, if a prospect is visiting an institution's campus immediately before or after participating in an athletics contest or event on the institution's campus, the prospect must depart the locale of the institution the calendar day before or after the contest or event.

Evaluation Days

Fall Contact Period

Evaluations at sites other than the prospect's educational institution are prohibited during the fall contact period. Live evaluations at prospect's educational institution shall be limited to regularly scheduled high school, preparatory school and two-year college contests/tournaments and practices and regular scholastic activities involving prospects enrolled only at that institution.

Academic Year Evaluation Period

All evaluations during the academic year evaluation period shall be limited to regularly scheduled high school, preparatory school and two-year college contests/tournaments, practices and regular scholastic activities involving prospects enrolled only at that institution.

April Contact Period

Evaluations at Nonscholastic Events

Evaluations at nonscholastic events during the April contact period are limited to events that are approved, sanctioned, sponsored or conducted by the applicable state high school, preparatory school or two-year college association, National Federation of High School Associations or the National Junior College Athletic Association. Coaching staff members may only attend such an event on Saturday and/or Sunday, and not on any weekend during which the PSAT, SAT, PLAN or ACT national standardized tests are administered, regardless of where the event occurs. If an approved nonscholastic event occurs at a high school, preparatory school or two-year college, it is not necessary to have a contact with a prospect who attends the educational institution.

Evaluations at a Prospective Student-Athlete's Educational Institution (Other Than Nonscholastic Events)

Evaluations are permissible at a prospect's educational institution shall be limited to regularly scheduled preparatory school or two-year college contests/tournaments, practices and regular scholastic activities involving prospects enrolled only at that institution, and only in conjunction with an off-campus contact.

Summer Evaluation Period

During the summer evaluation period, a member of an institution's basketball coaching staff may attend noninstitutional nonorganized events (e.g., pick-up games), institutional basketball camps and noninstitutional organized events (e.g., camps, leagues, tournaments and festivals) that are certified.

Predraft Camp Exception

Evaluations conducted at National Basketball Association (NBA) official predraft camps are not included in the 130 evaluation days.
