## Tuesday

### 10:10 to 11:10 a.m. - **Introduction to the NCAA Division I Academic Performance Program**

This session will cover the purpose of the NCAA Division I Academic Performance Program (APP); a basic explanation of the academic rates of measure; information about the basic penalty/reward structure; and other introductory information. The goal of this session is to provide attendees a basic foundation of the APP.

### 11:20 a.m. to 12:20 p.m. - **Contemporaneous Penalties**

This session will cover contemporaneous penalties, including how contemporaneous penalties are calculated and applied, the timing of taking contemporaneous penalties, waivers of contemporaneous penalties, conditional approvals and NCAA Division I Academic Progress Rate (APR) improvement plans.

### 1:15 to 2:45 p.m. - **Data Collection - APC, APR and Graduation Rates**

This session will cover the APR, Academic Performance Census (APC), Graduation Success Rate (GSR) and the Integrated Postsecondary-Education System (IPEDS) data collection systems. This session also will include information about APR adjustments, the graduation bonus and interaction between the Legislative Services Database for the internet (LSDBi) and the data collection program.

### 2:45 to 3:45 p.m. - **Historical-Penalty Structure and APR Improvement Programs**

This session will cover incentives and the historical-penalty structure and APR improvement plans. Guest presenters from the membership will participate to share best practices for student-athlete academic success. This session will not cover historical penalty appeals process as that information will be covered in the “waivers and appeals” session.

### 4 to 5:15 p.m. - **Waivers and Appeals**

This session will include a review of the various waiver/appeal procedures that are part of the APP, including APR Adjustments and contemporaneous- and historical-penalty waivers. The session will review the types of waivers generally granted, the waiver directives approved by the NCAA Division I Committee on Academic Performance and the process for filing waivers.
